I. Welcome and Introductions

Mr. Pat Pruitt, Vice Chair, called the meeting to order. Vice Chair Pruitt announced that the meeting will be recorded in order to process the minutes. Vice Chair Pruitt welcomed everyone and committee members gave introductions.

II. Approval of the May 4, 2021 Minutes

The minutes from the 5/4/21 meeting were emailed with the meeting notice and included in the meeting packet.

ACTION TAKEN: Susan Stockton made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by Margaret Camp. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

III. Committee Education - Anderson County Disabilities and Special Needs Board

Ms. Jerrel Lynn King provided an overview of the Anderson County Disabilities and Special Needs Board. She stated that they provide services for individuals who are determined eligible, which includes a diagnosis of an intellectual disability and autism, autism spectrum disorder, or any related disability. They primarily serve individuals who have developmental disabilities. Referrals can be made through the telephone number 1-800-289-7012, and the individual must be present when the referral is made. ACDSNB provides Adult Day Services, including Career Preparation and Employment Group Services, Community Services, Individual Employment, Rehabilitation Supports, and Walgreens Employment Project.

Mr. Billy Hunter, OneStop Manager with Eckerd Connects, introduced himself and provided an update on the status of the SC Works centers. All WorkLink SC Works centers are currently operating with normal hours of 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Masks are recommended upon entry into the centers.

Ms. Windy Graham, staff to the WorkLink Board, referenced reports in the packet.

The Community Profile was available in the packet, beginning on page 4. Ms. Graham stated that the Community Profile shows economic, demographic, industry, occupation, and education data for the Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens area. The report can be revised to show individual counties and is updated approximately every 6 weeks.

The targeted population WIOA data is found on page 34. Aggregate information is given for July 2020 to June 2021. Ms. Graham reviewed the demographics and disability data.

WorkLink's unemployment rate is 4.3%, and the population of those with disabilities is higher nationwide at 10.9%. The percentage of our labor force with a disability is 21.3% (data from US Department of Labor).

Committee members shared agency updates.









Occupation Groups With Largest Number of Claims August 2021





Population by Age

















New Hires by Industry







(Population 25 Years and Older)


