I. Welcome and Introductions

Ms. Windy Graham welcomed everyone, and committee members gave introductions.

II. Approval of the January 4, 2022, Minutes

The minutes from the January 4, 2022, meeting were emailed with the meeting notice and included in the meeting packet. The meeting minutes passed in an electronic vote.

III. Committee Education - SC Legal Services

Mr. Mark Fessler, Attorney with SC Legal Services, presented SC Legal Services information. Mr. Fessler stated SC Legal Services is the only civil law firm for low-income individuals in South Carolina. The mission is that all low-income South Carolinians should have equal access to legal services and full and fair access to justice. There are nine offices around the state, which cover every county in SC. Eligibility includes income limits (125% of the federal poverty level) and limits on assets. There are a few grants that are available for services related to crime, eviction, and individuals who are 60 years or older. SC Legal Services is a pro-bono agency; however, clients will have to pay court filing fees, court costs, and process fees. Individuals can apply via phone (1-888-346-5592) or online (www.sclegal.org). Services include representation, counsel and advice, and community education. SC Legal Services handles consumer/finance, employment, housing, family law, education law, probate, public benefits, and elder law cases.

Mr. Billy Hunter provided an SC Works Centers update. All centers continue to operate from 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Masks are recommended and COVID-19 screenings are still completed for jobseekers in each center. CDC's recommendations will continue to be implemented across WorkLink centers. Mr. Hunter stated that an ADA large screen monitor was purchased for the SC Works Easley center. Expungement workshops and safety meetings will be happening more frequently in upcoming months. SC Works will be having an upcoming staff training on April 8, 2022. Offices will be closed from 1:30-5 p.m.

Ms. Windy Graham, staff to the WorkLink Board, referenced reports in the packet.

The targeted population WIOA data is found on pages 4-7. Aggregate information is given for July 2021 to January 2022. Ms. Graham reviewed the demographics and disability data.

The Community Profile was available in the packet, beginning on page 8. Ms. Graham stated that the Community Profile shows economic, demographic, industry, occupation, and education data for the Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens areas. The report can be revised to show individual counties and is updated approximately every 6 weeks.

WorkLink's unemployment rate is 3.0%, and the population of those with disabilities is higher nationwide at 9.1%. The percentage of our labor force with a disability is 22.8% (data from US Department of Labor).

IV. Other Business

Chair Gillespie shared that the next committee meeting will be on May 3, 2022, via Zoom.






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Annual Unemployment Rate (Unadjusted)

Industry Groups With Largest Number of Claims March 2022







Population by Age








Population by Gender











New Hires by Industry







(Population 25 Years and Older)


