I. Welcome and Introductions

Ms. Lisa Gillespie, Chair, called the meeting to order. Vice Chair Pruitt announced that the meeting will be recorded to process the minutes. Vice Chair Pruitt welcomed everyone, and committee members gave introductions.

II. Approval of the August 3, 2021 Minutes

The minutes from the 8/3/21 meeting were emailed with the meeting notice and included in the meeting packet.

ACTION TAKEN: Edgar Brown made a motion to accept the minutes as presented, seconded by Pat Pruitt. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

III. Committee Education - Foothills CAN

Mr. Mike Cannon spoke to committee members about the Foothills CAN organization. Foothills CAN was built from the concept of the Collaborative Action Network (CAN) approximately four years ago. Foothills CAN was the third project in the state. The areas served are Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens counties. Foothills CAN assists individuals with disabilities with employment, housing, and transportation needs. Their mission is to make communities a better place to live, work, and play for individuals with all levels of disabilities. Mr. Cannon told committee members about the Jericho Project at Southern Wesleyan University, which is a facility for individuals with disabilities to be partnered with a SWU student and live in a dorm like setting. There are currently 11 individuals with disabilities and 9 students living at the

Jericho Project. Additional information on Foothills Collaborative Action Network can be found on their website at www.foothillscan.org.

Mr. Billy Hunter, OneStop Manager with Eckerd Connects, provided an update on the status of the SC Works centers. All WorkLink SC Works centers are currently operating with normal hours of 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Masks are recommended upon entry into the centers. SC Works centers are now requiring a health screening question for individuals who enter a center.

Ms. Windy Graham, staff to the WorkLink Board, referenced reports in the packet.

The Community Profile was available in the packet, beginning on page 4. Ms. Graham stated that the Community Profile shows economic, demographic, industry, occupation, and education data for the Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens area. The report can be revised to show individual counties and is updated approximately every 6 weeks.

The targeted population WIOA data is found on page 34. Aggregate information is given for July 2021 to September 2021. Ms. Graham reviewed the demographics and disability data.

WorkLink's unemployment rate is 3.8%, and the population of those with disabilities is higher nationwide at 10.9%. The percentage of our labor force with a disability is 21.6% (data from US Department of Labor).

IV. Other Business

Chair Gillespie shared that October is Disability Awareness month and this year's theme is Powered by Inclusion. All committee members are invited next Friday at 10 a.m. to the Community Impact Awards at the Anderson Civic Center. An employer who hires individuals with disabilities and an employee with a disability will be recognized.

The 2022 meeting calendar was sent for an electronic vote and passed. The meeting dates will be as follows: January 4, March 1, May 3, August 2, and October 4.






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Annual Unemployment Rate (Unadjusted)





Occupation Groups With Largest Number of Claims November 2021










Population by Gender











New Hires by Industry









(Population 25 Years and Older)


