Welcome and Introductions

Vice Chair Pruitt welcomed everyone, and committee members gave introductions. Mr. Pruitt introduced a new committee member, Ms. Cynthia Sprinkle. Ms. Sprinkle is a Veteran Workforce Consultant for the SC Department of Employment and Workforce.

II. Approval of the October 5, 2021, Minutes

The minutes from the 10/5/21 meeting was emailed with the meeting notice and included in the meeting packet. The meeting minutes passed in an electronic vote.

| | Committee Education – WIOA State Plan Presentation

Ms. Jackie Taylor presented the PY 2020-2023 WIOA Combined State Plan, which is currently open for comment. Ms. Taylor reviewed the vision, objectives, supporting priorities, and WIOA Title I and III program highlights. Highlights of the supporting priorities include work-based learning and apprenticeship activity, soft skills, staff training, referral processes, rural needs, promising practices, and outreach to employers. Ms. Taylor reviewed participant, training, and credential data comparisons from PY2019 to PY2020. Some of the highlights from WIOA Title I and III Programs in the past year included investments, access to employment services, career exploration, and reemployment efforts. Ms. Gillespie also mentioned the Anderson County Ride to Work program as a local success.

Mr. Billy Hunter provided an SC Works Centers update. All centers continue to operate from 8:30 a.m.-5 p.m. Masks are recommended and COVID-19 screenings are still completed for jobseekers in each center. CDC's recommendations will continue to be implemented across WorkLink centers. Mr. Hunter stated that an ADA large screen monitor was purchased for the SC Works Easley center. He also stated

that a virtual expungement workshop took place in August 2021, and another is forthcoming. In November, staff members were trained on the VOS Greeter.

Ms. Windy Graham, staff to the WorkLink Board, referenced reports in the packet.

The Community Profile was available in the packet, beginning on page 4. Ms. Graham stated that the Community Profile shows economic, demographic, industry, occupation, and education data for the Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens areas. The report can be revised to show individual counties and is updated every 6 weeks.

The targeted population WIOA data is found on page 34. Aggregate information is given for July 2021 to December 2021. Ms. Graham reviewed the demographics and disability data.

WorkLink's unemployment rate is 2.7%, and the population of those with disabilities is higher nationwide at 7.7%. The percentage of our labor force with a disability is 23.3% (data from US Department of Labor).

Chair Gillespie shared that the next committee meeting will be on March 1, 2022, via Zoom.






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Annual Unemployment Rate (Unadjusted)





Population by Age

















New Hires by Industry









(Population 25 Years and Older)


