South Carolina Mobile Crisis Unit

Ms. Amanda Myers, Mobile Crisis & Jail Consultant at the South Carolina Department of Mental Health, provided an overview of the Mobile Crisis Unit services.

These units offer immediate support to individuals experiencing a mental health crisis, conducting assessments, and responding on-site when needed. Coordination with law enforcement ensures interventions are safe and appropriate.

The SC Mobile Crisis Unit operates 24/7 statewide and can be reached at (833) 364-2274. Additional resources include Crisis Text Line, Trevor Project Lifeline, Trans Lifeline, United Way, and an Interactive Mental Health Screener.

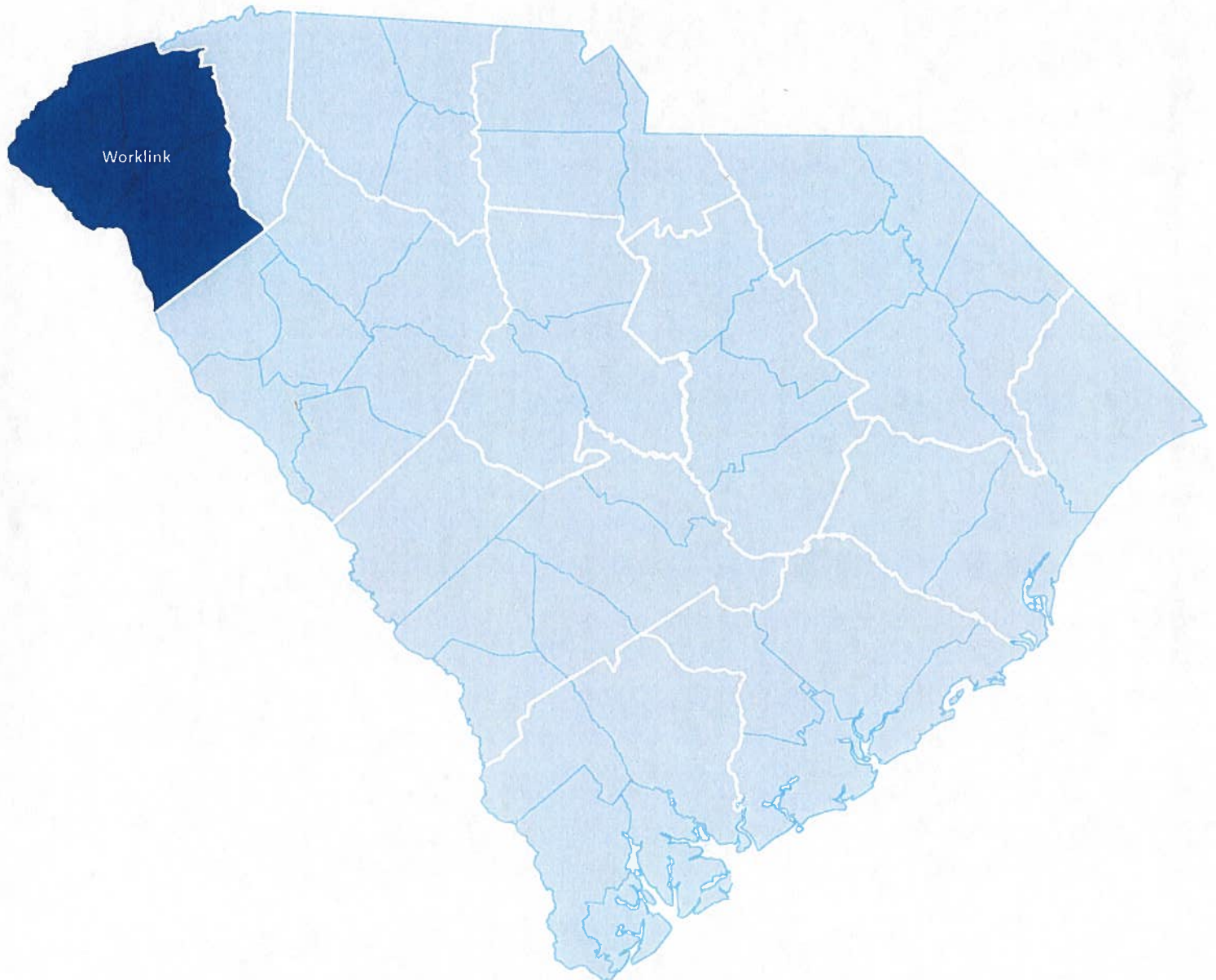

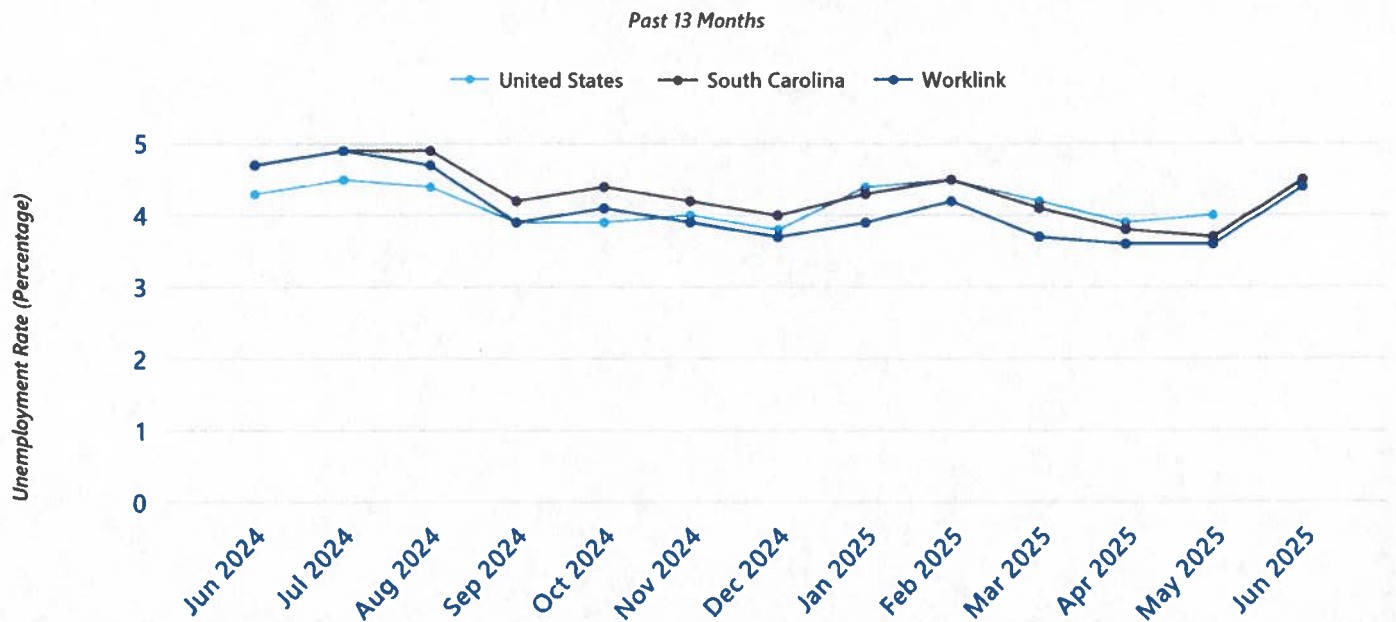

South Carolina's Employment Situation: June 2025

HOUSEHOLD SURVEY: LOCAL AREA UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

Nationally, there is a monthly Current Population Survey of about 60,000 households conducted by the Census Bureau for the Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) to determine employment status of the civilian population. This information, along with other inputs, are used by DEW to operate the Local Area Unemployment Statistics program, which estimates the number of individuals employed and those not employed, but actively seeking employment for statewide and a variety of substate geographies.



EMPLOYMENT:

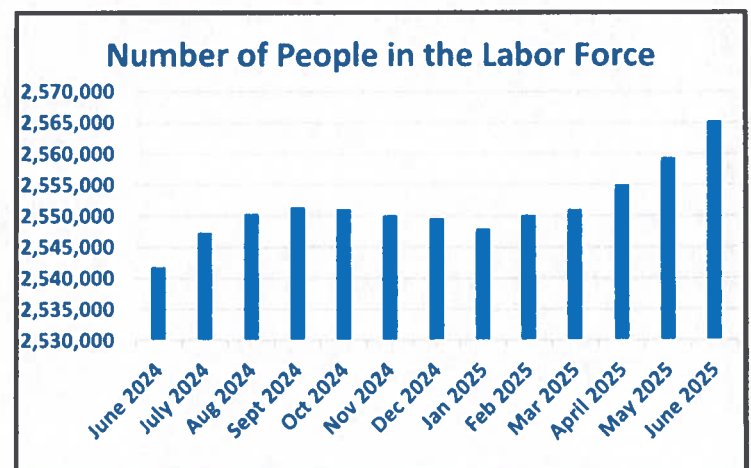
- The seasonally adjusted number of South Carolina workers increased to 2,459,338.
- That is an increase of 5,627 people over the May 2025 estimate.
- That is an increase of 28,694 people over the June 2024 estimate.

LABOR FORCE:

- The state's estimated labor force (people working plus unemployed people looking for work) increased to 2,565,289 while the labor force participation rate increased to 57.6 percent.
- That is an increase of 5,884 people over the May 2025 estimate.
- That is an increase of 23,468 individuals over the June 2024 estimate.

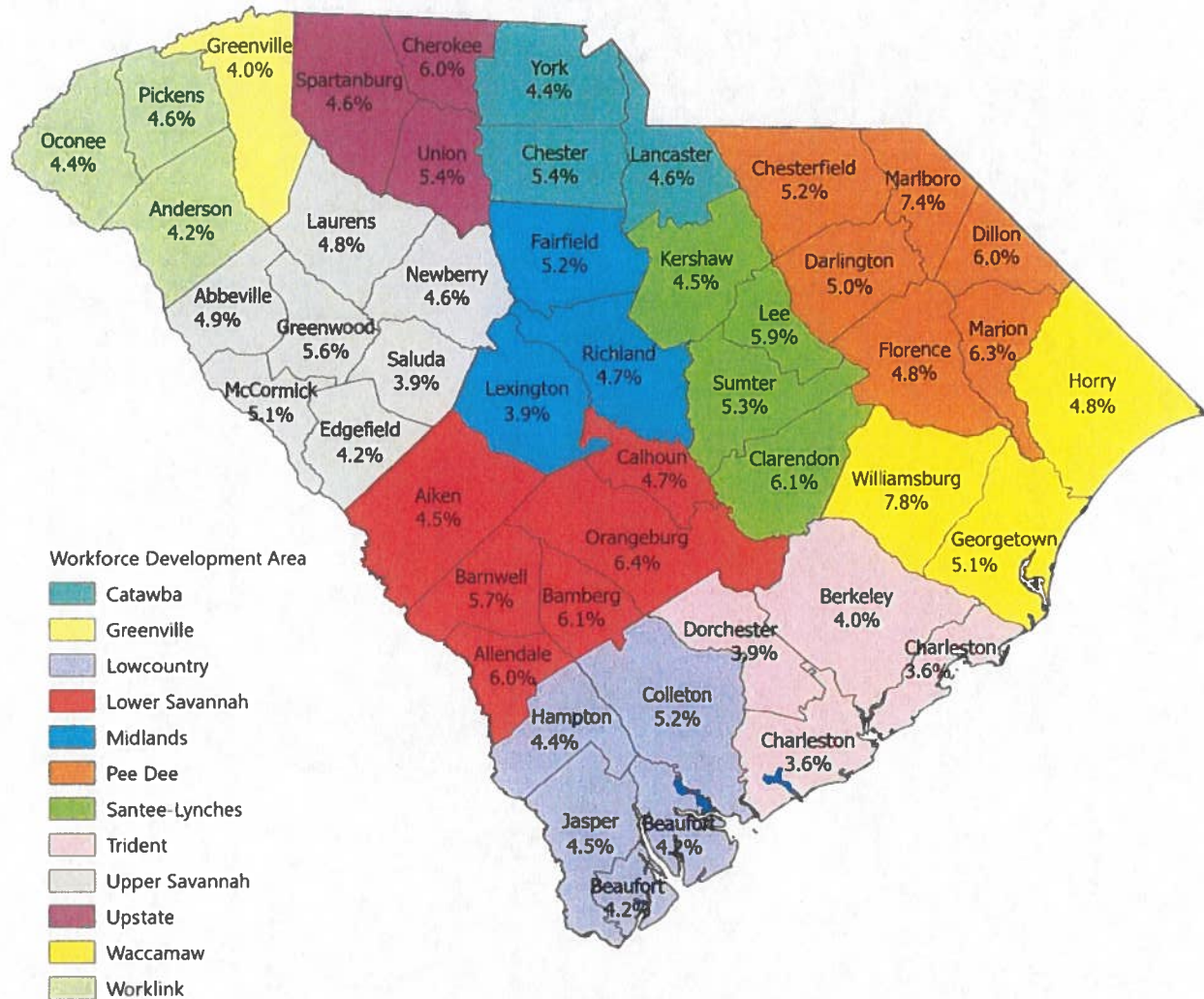
UNEMPLOYED:

- The estimate of unemployed people increased to 105,951.
- That is an increase of 257 people from the May estimate and a decrease of 5,226 from the June 2024 estimate.
- The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was unchanged 4.1 percent. The national unemployment rate decreased to 4.1 percent, according to the Current Population survey.



Seasonally Adjusted: Seasonal adjustment removes the effects of events that follow a regular pattern each year (i.e. tourist-related hiring and school closings in the summer). These adjustments make it easier to observe the cyclical and other nonseasonal movements in data over time.

EMPLOYER SURVEY: CURRENT EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS

BLS conducts a monthly Current Employment Statistics survey of approximately 119,000 businesses and government agencies which yields national estimates of nonagricultural wage and salary employment, hours, and earnings by industry. These data are processed by DEW to generate comparable data for the state and its metropolitan statistical areas.
