- Expungement workshops continue to grow, with evening sessions showing the highest attendance.
 - The next expungement session is scheduled for **March 20 at 10 AM**.
 - SC Legal has expanded services for homeless veterans, including National Guard members.

5. Worklink Data & Community Profile

- Priority Populations enrollment and barrier data were reviewed, including updates on veterans, individuals with disabilities, youth, and long-term unemployed individuals.
 - Staff noted discrepancies in wage reporting and are working with state partners to resolve the issue.
 - Unemployment rates have risen slightly across Anderson, Oconee, and Pickens counties.
 - National unemployment for individuals with disabilities remains significantly higher than average.

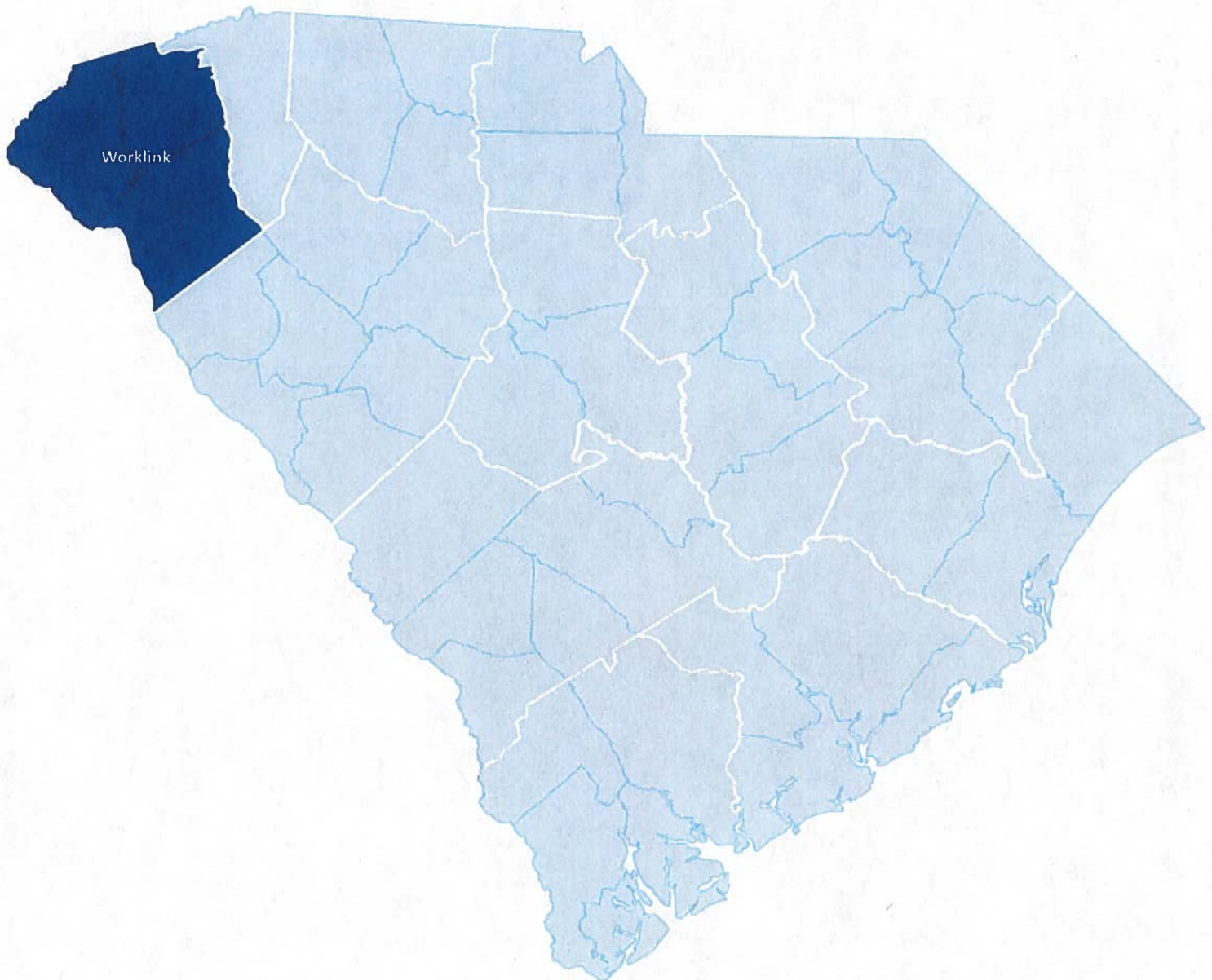

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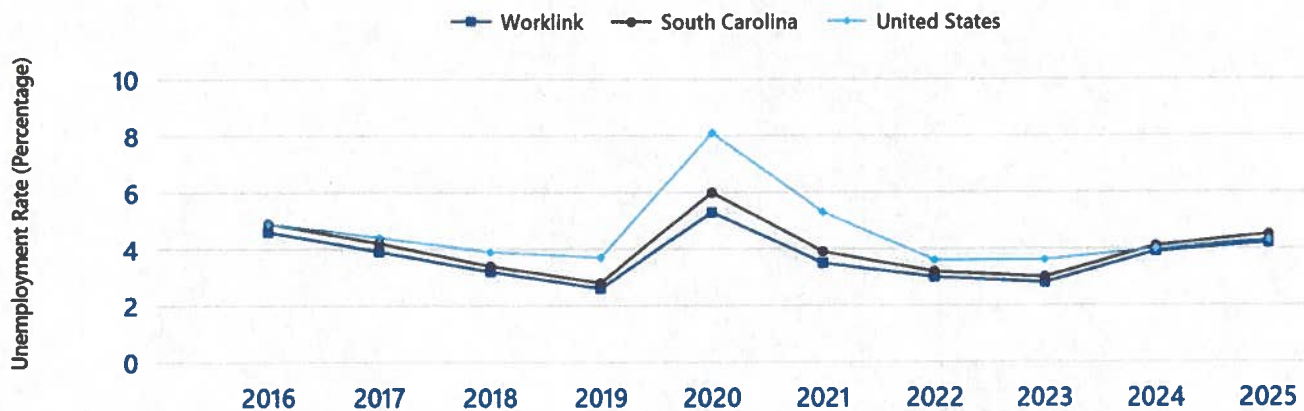
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ANNUAL UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

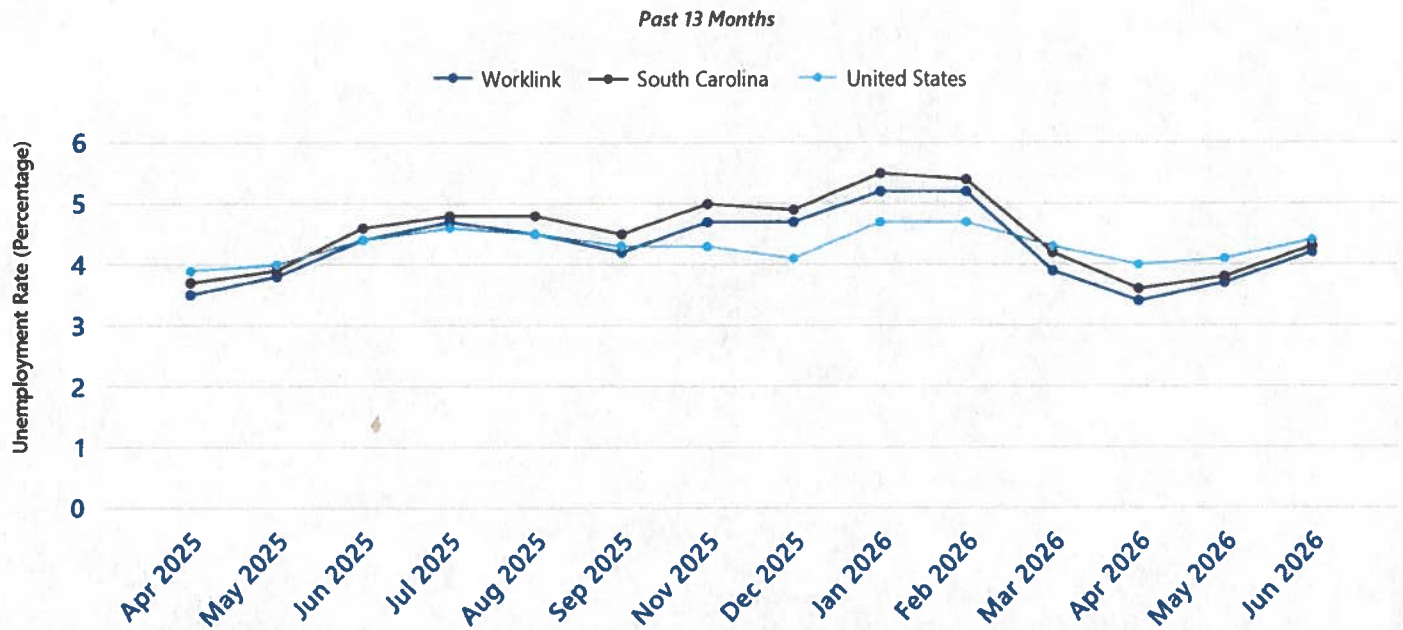

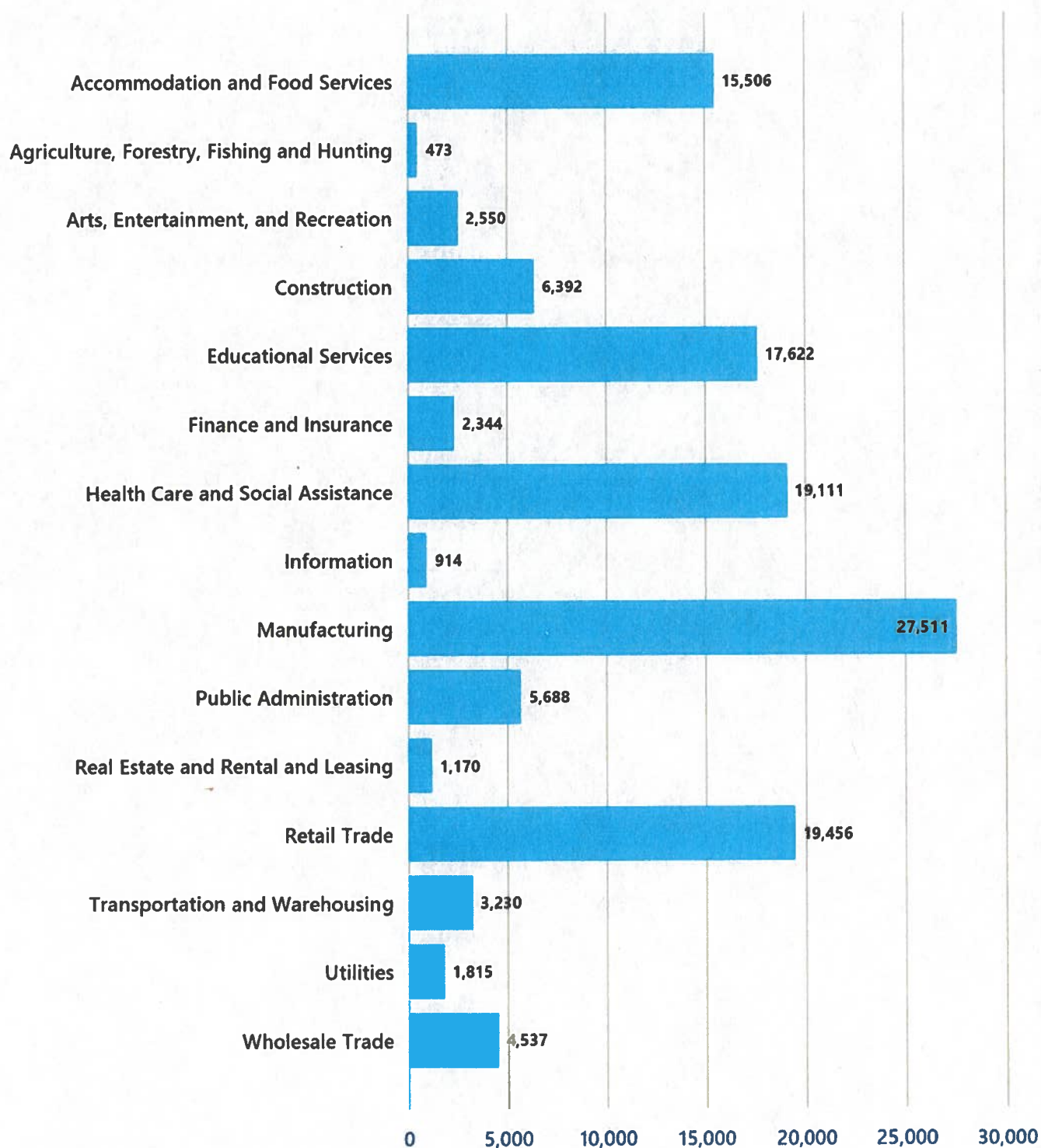

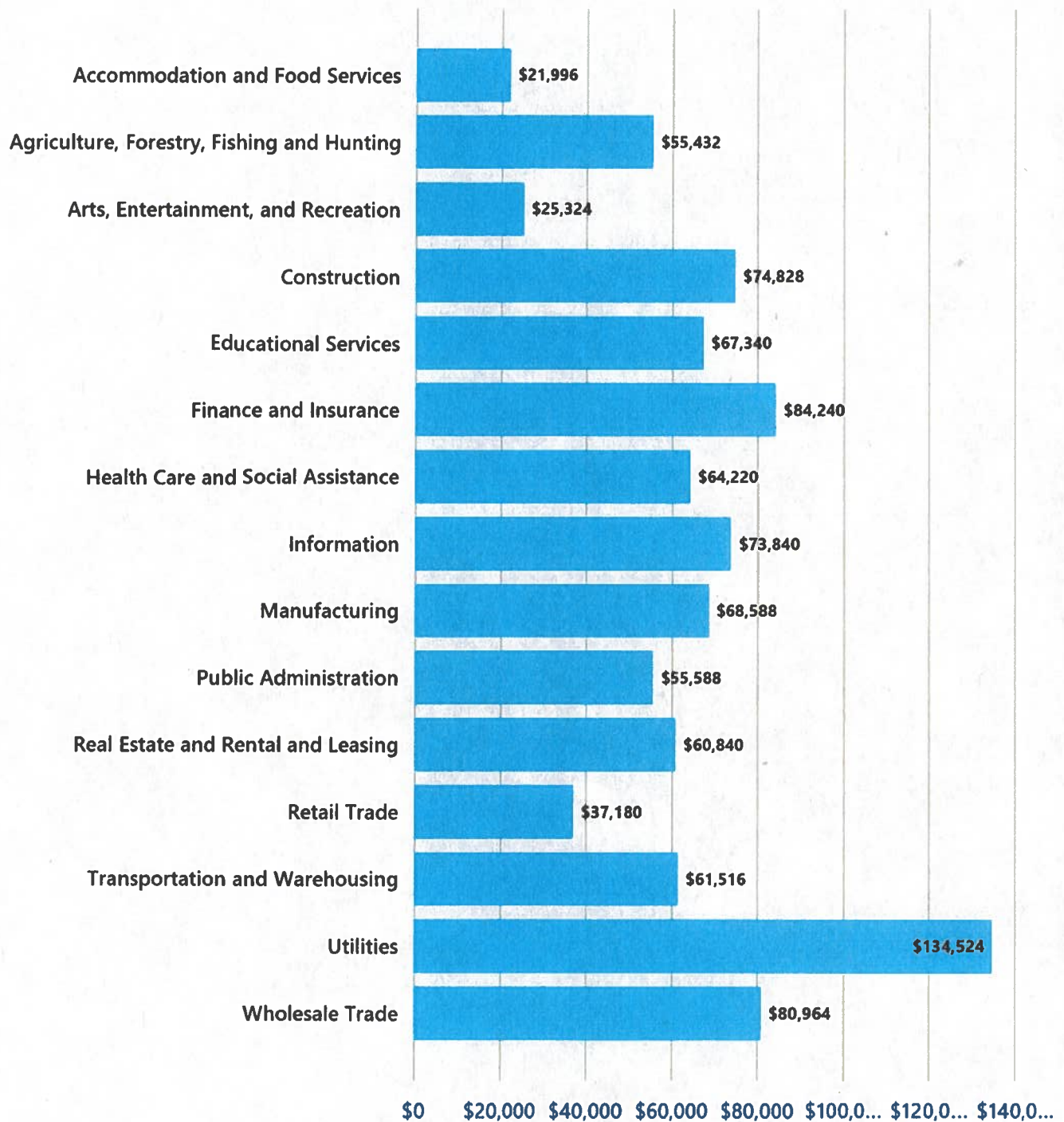

U.S. CENSUS BUREAU AMERICAN COMMUNITY SURVEY DATA

The next section of this profile consists of data from the American Community Survey, which is administered annually by the U.S. Census Bureau. The survey contacts one percent of all residents annually to generate data on a range of topics. However, accurate data from a single year of survey responses can only be generated for areas containing at least 65,000 people; five-year averages are reported for less populated geographies. To ensure that data are available for all areas and comparable across the state, all Community Profiles use these five-year averages that cover the years 2020 through 2024. Estimates with overlapping years should not be compared, since the repetition of sample data leads to statistical errors. For viable comparisons, the two prior non-overlapping five-year averages (2010-2014 and 2015-2019) are also provided. Each year, as new data is released, the profiles will increase by one year in the same manner, ensuring that non-overlapping five-year averages are always what is being compared.

U.S. CENSUS BUREAU LONGITUDINAL EMPLOYER-HOUSEHOLD DYNAMICS (LEHD) ORIGIN-DESTINATION EMPLOYMENT STATISTICS (LODES)

The Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD) program is part of the Center for Economic Studies at the U.S. Census Bureau. The LEHD program produces cost effective, public-use information combining federal, state and Census Bureau data on employers and employees under the Local Employment Dynamics (LED) Partnership. State and local authorities increasingly need detailed local information about their economies to make informed decisions. The LED Partnership works to fill critical data gaps and provide indicators needed by state and local authorities.

The statistics present in the reports that follow come from the U.S. Census's Longitudinal Employer-Household Dynamics (LEHD) Origin-Destination (OD) data set (LODES Version 8) for South Carolina – Type = JT00 for All Jobs. The data reflects in-state employment only. Residents of South Carolina working outside of the state are excluded.
